The Reverend Vern Barnet, DMn, completed his studies at the University of Chicago and an affiliated seminary with a doctoral dissertation applying a key Buddhist teaching to ministry. After serving parishes in Illinois, Pennsylvania, and Kansas, he was so charmed by friends of many faiths here that he decided to focus his work in Kansas City by creating the Center for Religious Experience and Study ("CRES"). Although his focus is local, he has spoken and been published internationally. With one foot in community organizing, the other has been in the academy, with adjunct teaching for Park and Ottawa universities and the Unity Institute, the Saint Paul School of Theology, Central Baptist Theological Seminary, and Sophia Retreat Center (Benedictine). Six weeks after 9/11, he presided over the area's first 3-day interfaith conference, "The Gifts of Pluralism," which he organized with the Interfaith Council and several other organizations. He brought to Kansas City the nation's first "Interfaith Academies for Religious Professionals and Students," created by the Pluralism Project at Harvard and Religions for Peace at the UN Plaza. He has been honored by Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Jewish, Muslim, Sikh, interfaith, professional, civic, and secular organizations. His book of 154 sonnets, *Thanks for Noticing: The Interpretation of Desire*, was published in 2015. He was the developmental editor for *Binding Us Together*, the autobiography of Alvin L. Brooks, published earlier this year.
